Summer is kind of a quiet time on the church calendar. Our biggest seasons are of course Advent and Lent. Our graduates have graduated, confirmation kids are enjoying their summer, and the summer has a tendency to pull us away from church a bit. God wants us to enjoy life and his creation so this is normal and expected. Summer church attendance is sporadic for many churches. In my experience, quiet times are the time of the most growth. The rains of May delayed planting for many but now (hopefully) the seed is in the ground and we wait.

A few years ago I learned about the principles of hiddenness and manifestation. That sounds kind of exotic but in reality, it just means that there are times when things are happening for us and times when we are waiting for growth. Have you ever felt like God is far away at times? At other times do you see, hear, and feel his presence easily? That's part of the natural cycle of things. How can we build our faith if we can always see, hear, and feel what's going on?

The seasons in between where things are growing are often the most fruitful. I take pleasure in waiting for things and on God's perfect timing. When I am waiting on an answer from him or waiting on a result I know that he's working on something wonderful. What is God developing in you through the waiting? Does God feel far away? Jesus told us that he will never leave or forsake you so I assure you that isn't the case. There are times when God feels hidden though. That's when the growth happens. Soon we will have days where it's too hot, too humid, and life feels like a reverse winter where there's a tendency to stay inside (if possible) and things slow down. This is when growth is happening that's not always apparent. Corn likes those kinds of conditions and it's necessary for growth.

What are you waiting on? What is God doing in your life? Does God feel hidden or very close? No matter the case we always have the right to go boldly to the throne of grace in confidence. You have that right because of your belief in Jesus Christ. Have a blessed summer and always remember that there is never a time that God isn't working in your life, even in the dog days of summer.







Baccalaureate Service will be held in Farmersburg, May 15th.


<u>New Business:</u>

Meeting adjourned at 8:09am, concluding with the Lord's Prayer. Respectively submitted by Melanie Lenth, council secretary.




