It's back to school time and it's time for confirmation class to start up again. In addition to confirmation class we are starting a new book(s) at WELCA Bible study. We are going to be studying the Epistles of John. Not the Gospel of John, but the three short letters written by John to believers. We do WELCA Bible study in Luana once a month and it's open to ALL women. You can be from St. John Farmersburg or anywhere else. We normally meet on the first Wednesday of the month at 5 PM. The discussions are very fruitful. Unlike a sermon or a video, you get a chance to discuss the word of God with other believers. When we are all looking at a passage we tend to notice things that have been hiding in plain sight sometimes. The word of God is so rich that you could read the Bible 1000 times and still keep finding new treasures. Hopefully a verse or two has come alive for you even though you've known it for years. Here are a couple of verses from the 1st Epistle of John that you may be familiar with:

If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he who is faithful and just will forgive us our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness. (1st John 1:8-9 NRSV)

As Christians we know that we aren't perfect! We know that we sin and truth is telling God about our sins. He knows and he's ready to forgive you when you ask. The blood of Jesus is more than enough to cleanse you from all unrighteousness.

My little children, I am writing these things to you so that you may not sin. But if anyone does sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous; and he is the atoning sacrifice for our sins, and not for ours only but also for the sins of the whole world. (1st John 2:1-2 NRSV)

John is telling us something simple. Don't sin deliberately. We want to avoid sin but when you do fall short, we have the best advocate or lawyer you could ever have. He is our high priest and your sins are covered when you ask for forgiveness in the name of Jesus.

It's a comforting and challenging letter(s). The Bible is great to read on your own but it's best when you can be in the company of other believers striving for the same thing. Join us or join a Bible study that feeds your soul. You will be glad that you did.
