There's something about fall, isn't there? The cool air, the leaves turning brilliant colors, and the days getting just a little bit shorter. It's like the world is slowing down and preparing us for winter by easing us into it. This season reminds us that life is full of transition. A time to pause, reflect, and take stock of where we've been and where we're headed. The Bible reminds us in Ecclesiastes 3:1-8:

For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven: a time to be born, and a time to die; a time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted; a time to kill, and a time to heal; a time to break down, and a time to build up; a time to weep, and a time to laugh; a time to mourn, and a time to dance; a time to throw away stones, and a time to gather stones together; a time to embrace, and a time to refrain from embracing; a time to seek, and a time to lose; a time to keep, and a time to throw away; a time to tear, and a time to sew; a time to keep silence, and a time to speak; a time to love, and a time to hate; a time for war, and a time for peace. (NRSV)

The Byrds made those verses a hit song in 1965 with "Turn! Turn! Turn!". These verses speak to us all and have been read at funerals, weddings, and everywhere in between, because they touch on a truth we all experience: life moves in seasons. Just as we watch the leaves change and fall from the trees, we too go through times of transition. There are periods of growth, times when we're in full bloom, and there are periods of letting go, where we shed things that have run their course.

Sometimes we're ready for those changes. Other times, they come unexpectedly, leaving us uncertain. Whether it's a new chapter in life, the loss of a loved one, or a shift in routine, Ecclesiastes reminds us that God is present in all of it. There's no season we face that God isn't aware of. He is there in the joyful times and the sorrowful ones, in the beginnings and the endings.

As we look at the changing world around us, we can take comfort in the fact that God has created this rhythm of life. Just like the farmer who sows in spring and reaps in fall, we too go through seasons of planting and harvesting, of waiting and growth. Each one has its purpose, even if we don't fully understand it in the moment. And in each season, God is working, shaping us, teaching us, and drawing us closer to Him.

As the late Tom Petty sang, "Waiting is the hardest part." Our waiting is often the hardest part of any transition. When we're between seasons—when it feels like we're neither here nor there—it's easy to wonder if God is still at work. But Ecclesiastes reminds us, there is a time for everything. Sometimes, the time for waiting is just as important as the time for action. Psalm 27:14 tells us, "Wait for the Lord; be strong, and let your heart take courage; wait for the Lord!"

Waiting is often where God does some of His best work in us, teaching us patience and deepening our faith. And while it may not always be easy, we can trust that He is working behind the scenes, preparing us for what's next.

So, as we move into this season of fall and reflect on the words of Ecclesiastes, let's remember that God is with us in every season of life. Whether we're in a time of abundance or a time of waiting, a time of joy or a time of sorrow, He is present. He is the steady hand guiding us through each change, the One who never changes, even when everything around us does.

Let's embrace this season, trusting that with God by our side, every change brings us closer to the new things He is doing in our lives. Blessings on your fall and in all seasons!




