March is here, and with it comes the beginning of the holy season of Lent. For us it's a time to pause, reflect, and prepare our hearts for the joy of Easter. In the stillness of these early spring days, we're invited to draw closer to God, seeking His guidance and grace in our lives.

Lent is a season that calls us to look inward and upward. It's a time to reflect on our relationship with God and the ways we can live more faithfully as His people. One passage that speaks beautifully to this is from the Psalms:

"Create in me a clean heart, O God, and put a new and right spirit within me. Cast me not away from thy presence, and take not thy holy Spirit from me. Restore to me the joy of thy salvation, and uphold me with a willing spirit." —Psalm 51:10-12 (RSV)

This season also encourages us to think about the sacrifices Jesus made for us and how we can respond in gratitude. While many people associate Lent with giving something up, it can also be a time of taking something on whether that's committing to daily prayer, reading scripture, or finding new ways to serve others. Small, intentional acts of devotion can bring us closer to God and remind us of His presence in our lives.

As the days grow longer and the first signs of spring begin to appear, we're reminded of the renewal that is possible through Christ. Just as the earth begins to awaken from winter's slumber, our spirits can be refreshed by the promise of new life in Him. Lent is a journey, and each step we take brings us closer to the cross and the hope of the resurrection.

During this month, I encourage you to find moments of quiet to reflect on Psalm 51. Maybe it's in the morning as the sun rises, or in the evening when the house is still. Let the words sink in: "Create in me a clean heart, O God, and put a new and right spirit within me." What does that look like in your life? Are there places where you need God's healing touch or areas where you feel called to grow?

Lent is not about perfection; it's about intention. It's about showing up with an open heart, ready to receive God's grace and to be transformed by it. Whether through fasting, prayer, or acts of service, every effort we make during Lent is an opportunity to deepen our relationship with the One who loves us unconditionally.

As we journey through this season together, let us hold fast to the hope we have in Christ. His love is unchanging, His mercy is boundless, and His promises are sure. At St. John Lutheran Church, we are blessed to walk this path as a community, supporting and encouraging one another along the way.

Thank you for being part of this family of faith. Let's make this Lent a season of renewal, reflection, and rejoicing in the love of God. May He create in us clean hearts and uphold us with willing spirits, now and always.



"The word 'March' comes from the Roman 'Martius'. This was originally the first month of the Roman calendar and was named after Mars, the god of war. March was the beginning of our calendar year. We changed to the 'New Style' or 'Gregorian calendar in 1752, and it is only since then when we the year began on 1st January. The Anglo-Saxons called the month *Hlyd monath* which means Stormy month, or *Hraed monath* which means Rugged month. All through Lent the traditional games played are marbles and skipping. The games were stopped on the stroke of twelve noon on Good Friday, which in some places was called Marble Day or Long Rope Day. The game of marbles has been played for hundreds of years and some historians say that it might have been started by rolling eggs. In the past, round stones, hazelnuts, round balls of baked clay and even cherry stones have been used."

Date: February 9, 2025



Vicky read the minutes of the January 19 meeting. Stan moved to accept the minutes, Diane seconded, approved.

The treasurer's report was reviewed. Vicky moved to accept the report, Diane seconded, approved.

Aaron gave an update on the parsonage repairs. Jim Meyer, Stan Dull, and Loren Lenth met with two contractors about the basement wall repairs. Jeremy reported that PEEPS is going well. There were 11 kids this past week. Karla commented that more upper elementary kids may come after sports seasons finish up.


Jerry adjourned the meeting. Members prayed the Lord's Prayer.

IN YOUR PRAYA

LSI PREP helps youth build social, emotional, and life skills to develop a positive sense of self and to connect with peers in their community. PREP utilizes the Teen Outreach Program and Wise Guys evidence-based curriculum. "Thank you for teaching our class and taking time out of your day to come to our school. I learned a lot about healthy relationships and how to handle my anger and other emotions. You opened my eyes to my family's habits and what I want to take with me when I have a family of my own."

"The letters that high school students write to our staff about what they learned in class and how they will use the knowledge in their everyday life shows the programs' tremendous impact," said April. "We meet the youth where they are at, but also encourage healthy decision-making along the way, which plays a huge role in making prevention education successful."

Furthermore, April's team encourages conversation and participation by providing incentives in the classroom, such as packaged snacks and other LSI materials. "When it comes to engagement in the classroom, I always say, "When their stomachs are full, their brains are full," shared April with a smile. "Some students would skip school all day, but they show up to the last class of the day, taught by LSI. That, right there, is a win for my team."

April's team has seen significant success in response to their CAPP and PREP community programs. Based on a post-program evaluation, 96% of students in the CAPP program reported that they learned "some" or "a lot" that they didn't already know about sexual health topics, and 53% agreed that they are now more likely to start conversations about these topics with others.

"Pregnancy rates have dropped over the last four years in many of our counties served, proving our services are making a difference in our communities," said April. "Reaching the youth on their level and prioritizing prevention makes our program successful."
